Anjali Watson has over the past 20 years focused much of her work on wildlife research and conservation. She is the co-founder and manager of the Wilderness & Wildlife Conservation Trust, Sri Lanka.

Part of a husband and wife zoologist / ecologist team, Anjali together with her husband Dr. Andrew

Kittle, have in addition to researching the leopard in Sri Lanka worked internationally on other species across multiple habitats.

Their work was recently recognized when Anjali was selected as a recipient for a coveted Whitley award which partners with global conservation leaders. She is a member of the International Union for Conservation's Species Survival Commission and Sri Lankan government scientific expert panels.
